

- Université de Montréal (U de M): Pavillon Lionel-Groulx, 3150 Jean Brillant St
- Concordia University: 1450 Rue Guy

PUB NIGHT



CATR/ACRT's welcome pub night will take place on **June 16th from 6:00pm – Onwards (EDT)** at McKibbin's Irish Pub. This is what McKibbin's looks like from the front (see above).

McKibbin's is about 11 minutes by car from U de M, and 30 minutes by bus (take the 166 from Place du 6-décembre-1989 to Guy / Sainte-Catherine).

Note: The pub can be accessed via 2 entrances. The upper-level entrance is accessible via 6 steps. The lower-level entrance (aka the "Speakeasy") is accessible via 4 steps on the left.

Teesri Duniya Theatre, Cité des Hospitalières is located in downtown Montréal along Pine Ave W and Park Ave.

This is where the Board meeting will be happening on June 16th, as well as where the Welcoming Remarks and Opening Performance will be hosted on June 17th.



Getting There

From VIA Rail Station (1110 Sherbrooke St W):

To get to Teesri Duniya Theatre, Cité des Hospitalières from VIA Rail Central Station, you can take the Metro from McGill station northeast one stop to Place-des-Arts.

From here, you can take the 129 Nord-Côte-Sainte-Catherine bus to Du Parc / Des Pins. Turn right onto Pine Ave W and arrive at Teesri Duniya Theatre, Cité des Hospitalières on your left.




Alternatively, you can take an Uber or a cab from the station (approx. 13 minutes), or you can walk directly from the station (approx. 30 minutes).

From Montréal – Trudeau International Airport:

To get to Teesri Duniya Theatre, Cité des Hospitalières from the airport, you can take the 747 bus from the airport east to Station Lionel-Groulx. From here, transfer to the Metro, line 1.

Travel from Lionel-Groulx station north-east for 5 stops and get off at Place-des-Arts. From here, you can take the 129 Nord-Côte-Sainte-Catherine bus to Du Parc / Des Pins. Turn right onto Pine Ave W and arrive at Teesri Duniya Theatre, Cité des Hospitalières on your left.



Alternatively, you can also take a cab or an Uber from the airport directly to Teesri. Some Cab companies include:

Cab Fare: A cab/Uber ride costs approximately \$50.00 - \$65.00 and takes around 50 minutes to reach downtown Halifax.



From McGill University:

To get to Teesri Duniya Theatre, Cité des Hospitalières from McGill, you can take the 80 bus north from Du Parc / Milton station. Take the bus for 3 stops and get off at Du Parc / Des Pins.

Turn right onto Pine Ave W and arrive at Teesri Duniya Theatre, Cité des Hospitalières on your left.




Alternatively, you can take an Uber or a cab (approx. 13 minutes), or you can walk directly from your residence (approx. 12 minutes).

Navigating Teesri Duniya Theatre, Cité des Hospitalières

This is what the front of Teesri Duniya, Cité des Hospitalières looks like (entrance on Pine Ave W):



Entering the Building



The building is accessible via the two entrances (see map above). The main entrance ("entrée poste de garde") is accessible via 251 avenue des Pins. Turn left off of 251 Ave and then right at the doors with the stained-glass windows.

This is what the front of the main entrance (“entrée poste de garde”) looks like.

****Note:** There are no push buttons available at the front doors. This is what the inside of the front lobby looks like:







After entering the building, turn right and follow these stairs to the top.
****Note:** There are no elevators available on this floor.



At the top of the stairs, turn right through this door, and then left through the set of wood doors.



Walk straight through these doors.



Walk past the stairs on your left and go through these doors.



Walk straight down the hall through these double doors.



Continue through these double wooden doors into Salle




The washrooms are located through the first door on the left.

DIRECTIONS – Université de Montréal

Where is U de M located?




The group of U de M buildings that we will be using for the conference are located in downtown Montréal between chem. de Polytechnique and Entrée boul. Édouard-Montpetit.

This is where most sessions will be happening, as well as where the Quiet Space will be located, and where the publisher's showcase will be held.


During the conference, the following 3 U de M buildings will be used:



- 3200 rue Jean-Brillant (**Building 27 on the U de M Map**)
- Pavillon André Aidenstadt – 2920 chemin de la tour (**Building 19 on the U de M Map**)
- Pavillon de la Faculté de l'aménagement – 2940 ch. De la Côte Ste-Catherine (**Building 36 on the U de M Map**)

Getting There - 3200 rue Jean-Brillant (Building 27):



From Teesri Theatre, there are several ways to get to Building 27 (3200). You can take an uber or cab (approx. 11 minutes), or you can take public transit.


If you're going by bus, you can take the 129 from Du Parc / Des Pins for 18 stops north and get off at Côte-Sainte-Catherine/Decelles. From here, turn left onto Decelles Ave. Walk for approx. 8 minutes and turn left onto Jean Brillant St. Walk for about another 4 minutes and arrive at Building 27 on your right.

Alternatively, the nearest Metro stops are Côte-des-Neiges or U de M. If you get off at are Côte-des-Neiges, take exit “A.” Once you exit the metro, this is what the doors look like behind you. The sign reads fro left-right: “A, Côte-des-Neiges , 5316.”



If you get off at U de M, continue straight ahead to the sign that says “Jean Brillant.”

Once you’ve exited the metro, turn right and walk south down Chem. De la Côte-des-Neiges to the crosswalk. Cross the street and turn left onto Jean-Brillant St. There will be a sign that says: “Promenade Jean-Brillant.”



Walk down Jean-Brillant street for about 2 blocks. You will pass Jean-Brillant Park and cross the next intersection (Jean-Brillant & Decelles). Continue walking east towards the colorful buildings. Building 27 (3200) will be on your right. This building is also called: “The Library Building.”

Note: There will be a sign at the front of the building indicating that this is Building 27 (3200).

Navigating Building 27:

This is what the outside of the building looks like:



The building is accessible via two sets of stairs at the front, or a wheelchair ramp on the right side:



The push buttons do not work on the outside set of doors but are working on the inside set. Once inside, the lobby of the building looks like this:



To access the spaces for the conference, you can either take the stairs (located on your immediate right), or the elevator (located on your immediate left):

If you would like to visit the Playwrights Canada Press or Talonbooks tables, they will be located on the 2nd floor of the Jean-Brillant building for the duration of the conference:



4th Floor Classrooms

If your session is on the 4th floor, you can either take the stairs or the elevator. Once you get off the elevator, follow the signs to your room.



This is what the outside of the classrooms look like:



This is what the inside of the classrooms look like. All of the rooms have the same configuration. There is some natural light, along with the fluorescent lights in the classroom:



B-0325

Room B-0325 is located in the basement. To get there, take the elevator or stairs down to level “0.” There are overhead signs on the ground floor that read “0325”, and which point towards the stairs.

This is what the outside of B-0325 looks like:



This is what the inside of B-0325 looks like with the lights on:



Washrooms:


The washrooms are located at either end of the hallway. These washrooms do not have any push buttons and are not gender neutral.



Getting There – Pavillon André Aidenstadt (Building 19):

From Teesri Theatre, there are several ways to get to Building 19 (2920). You can take an uber or cab (approx. 11 minutes), or you can take public transit.

If you're going by bus, you can take the 129 from Du Parc / Des Pins for 16 stops north and get off at Côte-Sainte-Catherine / Hudson. From here, walk south towards Tour Rd. Turn right onto Tour Rd and walk for approximately 8 minutes left. Arrive at Building 19 on your left.




Alternatively, you can take the metro and get off at the U de M metro station.

From U de M metro station, take the exit towards Université de Montréal.

****Note:** This entrance is not a wheelchair accessible.



Once you exit the metro, turn right. Turn right again and walk into the building with three escalators. Take the escalators to the top:



Once you reach the top, there will be another set of stairs to your right. Follow these stairs and exit the station. You should enter a road that overlooks a forest area. If you look behind you, these are the doors that you should have come out of:



Once you exit the station, turn left and walk until you come to an intersection with Ch. Des Services. You will need to cross the street and turn left onto Tour Rd. Arrive at building 19 on your left.

Navigating Building 19:

This is what the outside of the building looks like:



There are a few stairs to enter the building. This building does not have a wheelchair ramp, or push-to-open buttons.

1140 & 1177:

Once you enter the building, if you are in either room 1140 or 1177, turn left down the hall and you will find the room for your session:



This is what the door will look like for 1140 and 1177. It is grey and has a lower handle on the left, with some windows inside. These rooms do not have windows, but are brightly lit.




1411:

To get to 1411, walk straight when you enter the building and turn right. There will be large signs that have the room numbers on them with arrows in orange.



1411 is located down a short hallway and has a grey door. On the way there are three garbage/recycling bins.



Getting There – Pavillon de la Faculté de l'aménagement, 2940 (Building 36):

From Teesri Theatre, there are several ways to get to Building 36 (2920). You can take an uber or cab (approx. 13 minutes), or you can take public transit.

If you're going by bus, you can take the 129 from Du Parc / Des Pins for 12 stops north and get off at Côte-Sainte-Catherine / De Darlington. From here, walk west along Côte-Sainte-Catherine for approx. 2 minutes and arrive at Building 36 on you left.



Alternatively, you can take the metro and get off at the U de M metro station. Once you arrive at U de M station, exit right and follow the street around the corner. This is the sign where you will need to exit. The sign reads: “Faculté de l’aménagement – the street name is: Boul. Edouard – Montpetit.



If you are coming from Jean-Brillant St, you will need to exit via the street entrance, turn right, and follow the street east. There is currently construction so you will need to walk on the north side of the street.



As you walk east along Jean-Brillant, the street will become Louis-Colin. Turn left just before the metro station:



Continue walking straight until you reach a wooded area. Keep walking straight and arrive at Building 19 in front of you.



This is what the entrance to the building looks like:



Navigating Building 36:

To access the building, cross the interior bridge and enter the elevator located straight ahead.

Once you're off the elevator, walk straight past a set of recycling bins and follow the hall around the corner. Pass a vending machine and follow the hall. The session rooms will be located on your right.



0028:


Here is what Room 0028 looks like:



This room has moveable seating, bright lighting, and some windows in the back.

0030

Room 0030 is located down a wide, bur short hallway with three garbage/recycling bins. It is just before room 0028:



Room 0030 is a large room. The lighting is dim, but there are windows that bring in natural light.



3110

To get to room 3110, take the elevator to the third floor. Once there, turn left. This is the hallway you will need to take to get to the room:



There are two doors to enter 3110. This space is not wheelchair accessible as it is a raked auditorium. The doors to this space are heavy.




3310 has fluorescent lighting and is a large space:



DIRECTIONS – Concordia University

Where is Concordia located?

The Concordia spaces that we will be using for the conference are located in the John Molson building located between Guy St and Police St.




Address: 1450 Rue Guy

This is where the praxis sessions will be happening.

Getting There

From Teesri Theatre, there are several ways to get to Concordia. You can take an uber or cab (approx. 8 minutes), or you can take public transit.



You can take the metro from Place-des-Arts 3 stops west to Guy-Concordia. From here, cross the street and arrive at the John Molson building in front of you.

When leaving the metro, walk towards Université Concordia. Turn left and take the escalator up to the street level when you exit:



When you exit, cross the street going west toward the Molson building. This is what the building looks like from the front:



Navigating Concordia:

When you enter the building, you will walk past the security desk and the elevators will be on the right:



7.270 & 7.425

Take the elevator to the 7th floor. Once you get off, turn right towards the lockers to get to 7.270. To go to 7.425, turn left and then right.

****Note:** There are no public bathrooms on this floor. The closest accessible bathrooms are on the 5th floor or 1st (RC) floor, past security to the left when you exit the elevators.



Getting From U de M to Concordia:

If you are commuting from U de M, walk down the Promenade Jean-Brillant (pictures earlier) and take the 165 Côte-des-Neiges south to Guy-Concordia metro.



You will need to walk east on De Maisonneuve to the stop light and the Molson Building will be on your right.

Getting From Concordia to U de M:

If you are commuting back ot U de M from Concordia, take the 165 Côte-des-Neiges north and get off at Côte-des-Neiges metro. The bus stop is located across from the metro station. Walk down Promenade Jean-Brillant (see previous directions for more).

The journey should take approx. 15 minutes. The bus usually takes about 10 minutes or less to arrive.




GRAD & PRECARIOUS SCHOLAR SOCIAL

CATR/ACRT's Grad & Precarious scholar social will take place on **June 18th from 6:30pm – 9:30pm (EDT)** at Brasserie Artisanale L'Amère à Boire. This is what L'Amère à Boire looks like from the outside. The pub can be accessed via the front door on the left:



L'Amère à Boire is about 8 minutes by car from McGill, and 20 minutes by metro (take the green line from McGill to Station Berri-UQAM).

Address: 2049 Rue Saint-Denis, Montréal



This is what the inside of L'Amère à Boire looks like. Note: we will be sitting on the covered terrace (see image 2):



Note: of L'Amère à Boire is primarily a brewery. Some food may be purchased on site, but we will also be ordering in outside food and drinks, depending on what attendees would like.


BANQUET

CATR/ACRT's Banquet will take place on **June 19th from 6:30pm – 11:00pm (EDT)** at Wienstein & Gavino's. This is what Wienstein & Gavino's looks like from the outside. The restaurant can be accessed via the front doors on the left:



Wienstein & Gavino's is about 12 minutes by car from U de M, and 30 minutes by bus (take the 165 south for 15 stops from Côte-des-Neiges to Guy-Concordia. Walk west along Blvd. de Maisonneuve Ouest until you reach Crescent St. Turn right on Crescent St and arrive at Wienstein & Gavino's on your right.

Address: 1434 Rue Crescent

Food & Restaurants

****NB:** If you arrive over the weekend, most places close after 5pm.

Here are some great places to eat in Downtown Montréal:

- There are a variety of restaurants to choose from along Rue. Crescent
- The cheapest restaurant to eat at is the Warehouse on Crescent – every menu item is under \$10.00.
- There are a number of places to eat at Time Out Market at 705 Saint-Catherine St W (about 15 minute walk from Concordia spaces).
- There is a Tim Hortons at 2035 Stanley St.

Here are some food places that are close to Teesri Theatre:

- Boul. St-Laurent (North of Av. Des Pins) – Slice and Soda (it is only about \$6 for a large slice of pizza, highly recommended)
- South on Boul. St-Laurent at the intersection of Rue. Ontario, Eva B. a vegan café there are options that are under \$10
- UTO Sushi, 3717 Rue Saint-Urbain
- Café Nocturne, 19 Prince Arthur St W
- Starbucks, 3601 St Laurent Blvd
- Arepera, 73 Rue Prince-Arthur E
